3. Find a report sheet that works for you. You may need to change your sheet and that is okay! Finding the sheet that works for you takes trial and error.

4. Practice patient communication. There is nothing that takes the place of talking with your patient(s).

5. Be early and be prepared.

6. Have a good attitude and realize that you are there to assist with patient care. We learn from all professions and by doing all tasks.

7. Be respectful. Being respectful to your instructor(s), colleagues, patients, etc. Being respectful is a huge part of being professional.

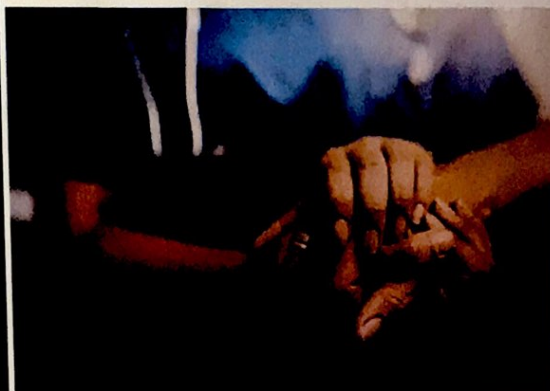


We are planning some days to work together to clean up and redecorate LH&R center garden. More information on dates to follow!
